Journey down the southern hallway (yes, toward the restrooms) and notice the cards and notes of thanks posted on the first bulletin board. You will also find pictures of the Sunday School wrap up Sundaes Sunday on the second bulletin board. It makes you smile. Looking for information, books, or devotionals? From our Interim Senior Pastor

Greetings and blessings to all as we head into summer 2010! I bring you several bits of news that may be of interest.

First, with regret, I must inform you that our Synod Bishop, The Rev. Stephen Marsh, has resigned his position. Bp. Marsh has been in treatment for addiction issues, and finds a need to re-enter residential treatment in order to ensure his continued recovery. As this treatment is of an indefinite period of time, he felt he could not faithfully discharge his duties as bishop in the near future. His resignation was accepted with regret by the SE Michigan Synod Council and we were notified of this on June 25th. Please keep him, our Synod staff and Council and our congregation in your prayers. I have been asked whether this will have any particular impact on All Saints' call process, and I don't believe it will. The person, Pr. Cherlyne Beck, who is in charge of this area of the Synod's ministry, remains in office and will continue in her duties. Retired Bishop Kenneth Olsen, from the Chicago area, has agreed to be our interim bishop. This makes the third time he has served us in this capacity, having been our interim bishop following the death of Bishop Schreiber and the resignation of Bishop Rimbo. I personally welcome him and rejoice that he is willing to serve us out of a well-deserved retirement once again. He is a wonderful person, very capable and understands the nature of our challenges here in SE Michigan.

Second, I am pleased to report that our Call Committee has completed a major portion of its' task-the Ministry Site Profile. This document, based on extensive consultation across the All Saints community, reflects our sense of identity and mission, and will be given to potential candidates to review before deciding whether they would be interested in interviewing with our Call Committee. They have done an excellent job-it is a well-prepared, carefully thought-out document. I know that copies are available in the Narthex if you wish to see it, and that the committee is working on producing this document in a pdf format that can be downloaded off our website or otherwise accessed electronically.

Third, I am happy to tell you about the splendid new opportunity you all have to worship at All Saints. Our "Sunday Evening Drop In" service is held each week at 6:00 PM. We invite you to come as you are and share who you are! Our service will be led by a variety of people, and includes singing, prayer, scripture, sharing of faith stories or messages, holy communion, and much fellowship. It is a shorter service lasting about 30-45 minutes. Drop-in musicians are welcome to take part-we rehearse at 5:15 each week. If you are interested in being part of this service as a worship leader, reader, power point driver etc. please contact me or JoEllyn Bernardin, chair of our WAMO (Worship and Music Opportunities) team.

Finally, I wanted to say a few words about my recent travels. In early June I traveled with friends to Colorado, stopping enroute in DesMoines, IA, where I had a chance to reconnect with the Interim Ministry Network who was offering some workshops there. Then we proceeded to Greeley, CO. for a National Gordon Setter Specialty. In all there were about 12 people from Michigan in attendance, and we brought home a lot of wins throughout the week. My own puppy competed in 2 events and took 4th place in one of them, so I was very happy to see she was recognized at a national level. The weather in Greeley that week averaged in the mid-09s temperatures and sunny. Whew! Then we took off another 50 miles to the west to explore the Rocky Mountain National Park. If you ever have a chance to go there, please do so. It is stunning! During that part of the trip a cold front came through, and we had temperatures averaging in the high 40s with heavy rainstorms. What a difference. My friends and I did get in some bird watching and hiking, though. And we found the local dog park and were able to let the doggies run and play together. The day before we left it finally cleared up and warmed to the 60s, and we hiked up to a lake then later on to a waterfall. Awesome time reconnecting to God's creation. One of my friends, who thought was not particularly religious, commented to me while we were hiking, "If anyone doesn't think there is a God, they should come out here and see this. How do they think all this beauty got here?" I was so happy to have that initiative come from her, and to have a chance to share faith with her while hiking.

Council Meeting Minutes – June

Minutes from the June Council Meeting: June 10, 2010

Kathleen Waligura opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer.

Rick Mann made a motion to approve April and May council meeting minutes; Jo Ellyn Bernardin seconded. The motion carried.

OFFICERS REPORT: Council is looking into the South Lyon Power and Light Lease. The lease expires July 1, 2010 and it is the plan to remove All Saints from the lease. The call committee has submitted the profile to the Synod.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Committee reports were submitted to council members prior to the meeting. A few highlights:

- Worship and Music Opportunities reports that the first evening service will be held June 27th. Planning will occur during their regular meetings.
- Christian Education: VBS is planned for the last week in July and will occur in the evenings this year.
- Good News Team: The team is launching an enrichment series with the goal of community outreach. The first seminar will be held Saturday August 14th from 9-11am and the topic is "Positive Dog Training"
- Property Committee: work day is scheduled for Saturday June 26th.
- Managing a Christian Lifestyle: 34 people are registered for More than Money Matters, the workshop offered by Thrivent.

LITTLE SAINTS CHRISTIAN SCHOOL: The school was awarded a \$1500 Mt. Zion grant. The money must be used to purchase dividers. Some of the playground equipment must be removed according to State Law. The school will work to replace it. The equipment that must be purchased to be on compliance with State Law is much more expensive than the equipment that was in use. Rick Mann made a motion that the Preschool will sell the cited playground equipment and use the proceeds for replacement equipment. Jo Ellyn Bernardin seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Junior Kindergarten will start this fall and space allocation is being discussed.

SOUTH LYON POWER AND LIGHT: They are averaging about 22-25 people per week and the atmosphere is strong. They are working to use that enthusiasm to launch themselves into the community a bit more actively.

Heidi Mills moved to adjourn, Kathy Eklov seconded. Motion carried.
