All Saints Council Meeting – April 11, 2019

Below are the highlights of the All Saints Congregational Council meeting held on April 11, 2019. A copy of the complete meeting minutes are available in the office.

Discussion ensued on refinancing the mortgage through the Mission Investment Fund (MIF) to lower monthly payments to prepare for unexpected expenses/emergencies. The refinance would be at the current rate of 3.875%. This would result in a savings of over \$2,000 per month. Refinance would last for 5 years (2022) after which the payment gets updated to the current rate. This would result in a savings of over \$88,000 by 2022. A motion was made and seconded to accept this proposal.

Peggy Flatt will give a presentation on Vietnam on May 5 after the 10:30 service.

There have been a large amount of visitors – 10 on one Sunday. Two have asked about new member classes.

Guitars and More is going very well.

VBS will be held the first week in August.

Outside parking lot door has been fixed.

Light bulbs were replaced in the projector at a cost of \$277.

Brochures has been finalized and printed by VistaPrint at a cost of \$250. Donations of \$120 have been received.

All Saints Council Meeting – March 14, 2019

Below are the highlights of the All Saints Congregational Council meeting held on March 14, 2019. A copy of the complete meeting minutes are available in the office.

Financial Peace University starts March 26. Program is based on Dave Ramsey's budgeting methods. The charge for the book is \$109.

Received \$50 from Amazon Smile.

It was requested that Committee Chairs submit a wish list of needs including an estimate of costs.

A tri-fold brochure was developed and reviewed. This brochure will be passed out at the Hartland Memorial Day parade with the seed packets, at the new welcome center, etc. Quotes for printing will be obtained and compared to printing in-house.

Easter Baskets will be donated to LACASA, either with non-food items from their wish list or "fun" basket for kids.

Confirmation will be held on June 2, with 3 confirmands, Hannah Brady, Nathan Kahl and Hudson Schick.

What on earth is a Synod? What is Synod Assembly

Did you know that there is an annual gathering of church leaders which conducts the business of the synod? Did you know that All Saints is connected to a larger church body? Let's break this down a bit and talk about the structure of the church.

All Saints Lutheran Church is affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. (ELCA). There are two other synods of the Lutheran Church – the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod and the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. Anyway, the ELCA is headquartered in Chicago, Illinois, and we are lead by Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. Bishop Eaton was elected into office at the Churchwide Assembly in 2013. She is eligible for re-election at our Churchwide Assembly this August.

The ELCA has 65 synods. These 65 Synods are broken down into 9 regions. All Saints is part of Region 6, the IMOK Region, which is comprised synods in Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky. All Saints is part of the Southeast Michigan Synod (SEMI). Bishop Donald Kreiss is leads the SEMI Synod. Bishop Kreiss was elected into office in 2011 and was re-elected in 2017. In the SEMI synod, we have 109 congregations, which are further broken down into 11 Conferences. All Saint is part of Conference 1. Each Conference is lead by a Conference Dean. The Dean of Conference 1 is Pr. Denise Russell.

Much like All Saints has a congregation council which makes decisions and helps to lead All Saints, the SEMI synod also has a council, this is called Synod Council. This council is comprised of 22 individuals, and is a mixture of rostered leaders (like pastors) and lay people. All Saints has been incredibly fortunate to have congregation members as members of Synod Council since 2011. Sonja Markwart has served on Synod Council since 2011 (she was appointed in 2011, elected in 2012 and 2015, and 2018, and was elected to be Synod Secretary in 2019), and in 2018, Jo Ellyn Bernardin was elected to a position as well.

All Saints is constitutionally required to have an annual congregational meeting. (The church constitution, not the United States or Michigan Constitution). Many of you have attended that meeting, it occurs in November of each year. The SEMI synod is also required to have an annual meeting, that is Synod Assembly and occurs in May of every year. Each congregation is allowed to send voting members to Synod Assembly. The pastors attend, as well as a male and female voting member. All Saints could send additional voting members by sending a youth (who has been confirmed) as well as anyone who is a person of color or whose primary language is other than English (your first language was not English). Members of Synod Council also attend as voting members.

This year, All Saints had 5 people attend Synod Assembly: Pr. Denise Russell, Brent Russell, Julia Keller, Jo Ellyn Bernardin and Sonja Markwart. The Assembly was held at Calvary Lutheran Church in Clarkston, on May 17 and 18. The theme of the assembly was Faith –Hebrews 11:1 "Now faith is the ASSURANCE of things hoped for, the CONVICTION of things not seen". The typical business that takes place: the approval of a budget, election of officers and synod council members, and the approval of Resolutions and Memorials. The agenda and all documents associated with Synod Assembly can be found on the Synod website: <https://www.semisynod.com/events/2019-synod-assembly>. There is a plethora of information available for you. Also, if you contact one of the 5 people who attended Assembly, we would be happy to let you know what happened and what we learned.

In August, Sonja Markwart will have the honor of attending Churchwide Assembly as one of the 11 delegates from the Southeast Michigan Synod. Look for an update of that amazing 5 day meeting in an upcoming publication of The Communicator.
